From the Pastor's Desk

"Everyone therefore who acknowledges me before humans, I also will acknowledge before my Father in heaven; but whoever denies me before humans, I also will deny before my Father in heaven."

Jesus calls upon his disciples to give an authentic witness to Him. In fact, this is not a matter of something optional or additional but

of something that decides our identity as Jesus' followers here below and for eternity as well. Perhaps, now this call is even more urgent when people throughout the world, including Christians, choose to live their life as if God did not exist.

This Tuesday, June 27th, many Catholics throughout the world celebrate the Feast of Our Mother of Perpetual Help who is known for miracles and answers to prayer, associated with a 15th-century Byzantine icon of the Madonna and the Child. The tradition of Our Mother of Perpetual Help dates back to 1495. Stolen from a Cretan monastery the icon was brought to the church of St. Matthew in Rome. For 300 years, it resided at that church, and even survived the church's destruction by Napoleon's army in 1798. 88 years later, Pope Pius IX gave the icon to the Redemptorist Congregation at the Church of Saint Alphonsus, where it remains today.

On Wednesday, June 28th, we observe the memorial of Saint Irenaeus, Bishop and Martyr. Irenaeus (c. 130 – c. 202) was a Greek bishop noted for his role in guiding and expanding Christian communities in the southern regions of present-day France and, more widely, for the development of Christian theology by combating heresy and defining orthodoxy.

On Thursday, June 29th, we celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles. As early as the year 258, there is evidence of an already lengthy tradition of celebrating the solemnities of both Saint Peter and Saint Paul on the same day. Together, the two saints are the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom there. Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee and was introduced to the Lord by his brother Andrew, also a fisherman. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petros in Greek and Petrus in Latin), which means 'rock,' because he was to become the rock upon which Jesus would build His Church. St. Peter spent his last years in Rome, leading the Church through persecution and eventually being martyred in the year 64. He was crucified upside-down at his own request, because he claimed he was not worthy to die as his Lord. He was buried on Vatican hill, and St. Peter's Basilica is built over his tomb. St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church. Before receiving the name Paul, he was called Saul and he was a Jewish Pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem. Paul spent his life preaching the Gospel tirelessly to the Gentiles of the Mediterranean world. Paul was imprisoned and taken to Rome, where he was beheaded in the year 67. He is buried in Rome where the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls was built. St. Augustine of Hippo in 395 in one of his many sermons (cont...)

Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith."

This week we observe the first Saturday of the month with the devotions to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This is also Canada Day when Canada's birthday is celebrated. We pray to be witnesses to Christ in Canada and in the world, and continue working to influence those in authority to act from Christian principles and attitudes.

Next Sunday, we will welcome to our parish community Sister Nancy Kamau from the Religious Community of African Sisters Education Collaborative who is coming to us with a mission appeal.
