

"Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation. (...) And they went out and proclaimed the good news everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the message by the signs that accompanied it."

Today's passage of the Gospel is often referred to as the

Great Commission due to the instructions Jesus gave to His disciples. He commanded them to go to all the world and spread the Gospel. It's a powerful call to action that holds significant relevance for Christians even today. Firstly, it emphasizes the universal nature of the Gospel message. Secondly, the passage highlights the importance of faith. Jesus promises that those who believe will perform miraculous signs, demonstrating the power of God working through them.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord which in Canada and other countries is transferred to the seventh Sunday of Easter. The exact fortieth day after the Resurrection of the Lord falls on Thursday of the sixth week of Easter which was the day when the Lord was taken up to heaven according to the Scriptures. The Ascension of the Lord underscores the divinity of Jesus Christ. As He ascends into heaven, He is not merely departing from His disciples, but returning to His rightful place of authority and glory alongside the Father. This reaffirms our belief in the dual nature of Christ - fully human and fully divine - and His role as the Saviour and Lord of all creation. The Ascension also serves as a source of hope and assurance for believers. Jesus' departure is not a cause for despair but a promise of His continued presence with them through the Holy Spirit. He assures His disciples that He will be with them always, even to the end of the age, empowering them to carry on His work and mission in the world.

This Monday, May 13th, we observe the optional memorial of Our Lady of Fatima which is a title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary after the apparitions to three shepherd children - Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco - at Cova da Iria near Fatima, a town about 120 miles north of Lisbon in Portugal in 1917. The apparitions took place form May 13th to October 13th of that year. The message of Fatima includes a call to conversion of heart, repentance from sin and a dedication to the Blessed Virgin Mary, especially through praying the Rosary. Mary gave the children three secrets. Following the deaths of Francisco and Jacinta in 1919 and 1920 respectively, Lucia revealed the first secret in 1927. It concerned devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The second secret was a vision of hell. When Lucia grew up, she became a Carmelite nun and died in 2005 at the age of 97.

Pope St. John Paul II directed the Holy See's Secretary of State to reveal the third secret in 2000; it spoke of a "bishop in white" who was shot by a group of soldiers who fired bullets and arrows into him. Many people linked this vision to the assassination attempt against Pope John Paul II in St. Peter's Square on May 13th, 1981. (cont...)

On Tuesday, May 14th, we observe the Feast of Saint Matthias, Apostle. According to the Act of the Apostles St. Matthias was selected to replace Judas and was received to the body of the Apostles. He is said to have preached in Judea, Cappadocia and on the shore of the Caspian Sea. Matthias was martyred in the Kingdom of Colchis (today in Georgia).

We keep praying the Novena (nine days) to the Holy Spirit that began last Friday.
